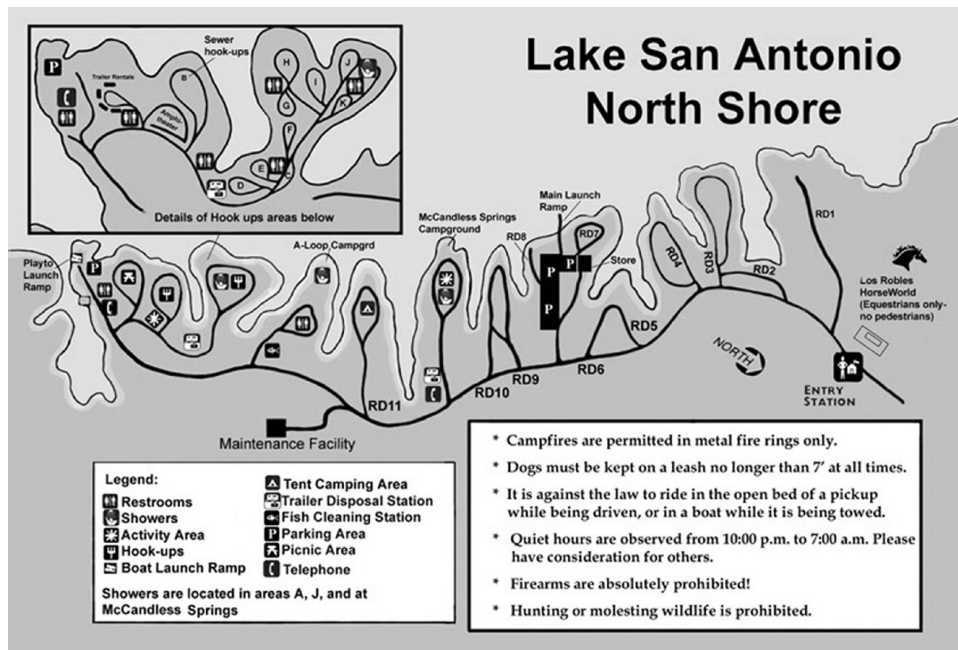
Next General Meeting May 8th, "Fun with Horses"

May 1-3, Camping with Horses, RSVP Apr 15

Lake San Antonio North Shore



SMHA members are invited to camp at **Lake San Antonio**, in southern Monterey County, over the first weekend of May. It is a popular park - the weather is usually mild at this time of year and the park will abound with a wide array of spring wildflowers as well as beautiful views of the lake. There is fresh-water fishing at the lake, hiking, camping and 14 miles of trails to enjoy. The park is home to eagles, heron, White Pelican, geese, quail, hawks, deer, coyote, bobcats and wild boar.

We will be dry camping as there is another group who reserved the main area of the horse camp. SMHA will be "housed" in the overflow camping area, providing plenty of space for us. We have 4 rigs signed up and will be limited to 15 rigs.

Bring portable corrals or be prepared to tie your horse to your trailer. Portable electric fences should be limited to no larger than 12x12 per horse. There are plenty of water spigots, but we are encouraged to bring a hose, splitter and shutoff valve. Each rig should bring food for the weekend – we would like to have group potlucks on Friday and Saturday evening.

Nice bathrooms with flush toilets and hot showers are available. The rangers are very responsive to our needs and will provide extra garbage cans and bar-b-que barrels if requested. As of this printing, cost will be \$25 per rig per night, payable at the kiosks. Additional vehicles are \$15. Day use is \$8 per day. The Santa Clara County Parks Equestrian Use and Trends Report is now available online at the County Parks website: www.parkhere.org

The Use and Trends Report summarizes the first phase of the Equestrian Stables Location Feasibility Study, which in addition to the information gathered from the public survey of over 600 respondents, examined the current stables facility at Calero Ranch Stables, evaluated current and future equestrian needs in Santa Clara County, and researched current practices and trends in other regional park systems throughout the San Francisco Bay Area.

Based on the information gathered from this phase of the project, County Parks will develop an outline of services and facilities that may included in a future equestrian stabling facility and evaluate alternative locations on public parklands where such a facility might be located.

April 4th and 5th, / Grant Ranch County Park Fence Construction Project

Help installing 45 -6 x 6 x 8' posts along the roadway adjacent to the road in front of the horse camp, which will then have 4 rails of 2x6x16' on them.

We will be using screws instead of nails so people can bring a drill; post hole diggers to clean out the pre-dug holes; and a tamping bar if you have them will help.

Rails can be stained by those not wanting to do heavy manual labor.

Theresa (the great Grant Ranch Equestrian Advocate Ranger) will stain the posts before everyone comes to install the fence.

The day will start at 9 am and go until 3 or if everyone wants to work later that is ok too.

There will be plenty of room to camp, so bring your pets, aka horsies - if you bring any dogs remember they must remain on leash at all times.

Rattlesnake Weather



Be aware, we found our first rattlesnake of the season. On a very cold and blustery day, the little snake had crawled between some aluminum roof panels that were stacked in the

sunshine. I believe it was a Northern Pacific Rattlesnake, like the picture from this website <http://www.wildherps.com/species/C.oreganus.html>. I've seen big ones when riding during the spring on a road through some very tall grass. Sprawled out on the dirt road, sunning itself was a rattler about six feet long and about seven inches around. Luckily for me, my horse just kept trotting and we sailed over him without an incident. Some rattlers, are not aggressive, but when cornered or surprised they will strike. The smaller snakes are more dangerous because they do not control the amount of venom they inject while biting.





Once at Calero park, my husband and I saw two large rattlers in a territorial dispute. It was a remarkable feat of strength and balance. We were trotting along and he called to me,

“Be careful, there’s a big snake here”. We stopped to watch it on the path, when to our amazement, we saw the second snake that was being pursued by the first. The snakes twisted their bodies around each other and rose into the air about a foot and a half. Then slammed back down to the ground. This ritual was repeated several times, and then the snakes crawled away in opposite

I’ve seen horses that have been rattlesnake bit on the face. A curious horse will follow the moving slithering stick and be bitten. The horse I saw had the lower half of it’s head all swollen, distorted in an elephant sort of way. The vet was called and gave the horse antivenin and the horse was fine. I do have some friends who lost a draft horse mare. The mare was autopsied and so much necrotic, black tissue was found on her hindquarters that the vet suspected it had to be rattlesnake bites, and more than one. My friends had to hand raise the young Clydesdale colt that was orphaned when this happened. The colt is now a beautiful 18h stallion, but the loss of the mare was quite traumatic.


